Our alumni have pursued careers in harp at major music schools and conservatories such as the Curtis Institute of Music, the Cleveland Institute of music, the Juilliard School, the Paris Conservatory, the Manhattan School of Music, Oberlin Conservatory, and Indiana University, to name just a few. The competition is designed to work alongside the YAHS and PREP programs by encouraging young harpists to strive for a high level of artistic achievement, providing them with an open forum for performance, positive feedback, and nurturing competition. We are excited to provide this opportunity for today's young harpists, and it is our number one goal to give each competitor an experience that will raise their level as a musician and enhance their ability as an artist.

We would like to give our sincere congratulations to every competitor who followed through with their goal of entering the competition, and we wish the very best of luck to all those competing in person this week!

YAHS Founders and Artist Faculty

A graduate of the Curtis Institute of Music, **Susan Bennett Brady** performs extensively in the Southeast as a classical free-lance harpist and soloist. She is principal harpist with the Atlanta Opera and Columbus Symphony Orchestras. She also has performed regularly as harp soloist with the Atlanta Boy Choir. She is the founder/director of the nationally acclaimed Atlanta Harp Ensemble. Susan also teaches at the Schwob School of Music at Columbus State University, is a mentor for the National Music Festival in Maryland, and has a private studio in Atlanta.

Kimberly Rowe is founding editor and web editor of *Harp Column* magazine. She currently resides in Boston where she oversees the company's web presence while also continuing to freelance. Originally from Philadelphia, she has performed numerous times with The Philadelphia Orchestra and other top ensembles in the mid-Atlantic and Europe. Kimberly has been a faculty member at Temple University, Curtis Summerfest, and the National Music Festival.

YAHS Faculty

Emily Levin is principal harpist with the Dallas Symphony Orchestra and Bronze medal winner of the 9th USA International Harp Competition. The youngest principal harpist of a major American orchestra, Emily has performed extensively, including Festpiele Mecklenburg-Vorpommern, the World Harp Congress, and the Aspen Music Festival. She is a winner of the 2016 Astral Artists auditions. Her first CD, entitled Something Borrowed, was released in 2017.

Canadian native **Angela Schwarzkopf** concertizes throughout North America as a soloist, chamber musician, and orchestral harpist. The first harpist to receive a Doctorate of Music in harp performance in Canada, she has also served as President of the Toronto Chapter of the American Harp Society since 2012. Angela is a course instructor at the University of Toronto and the Glenn Gould School of Music, and maintains a studio of private students in Toronto. www.angelaschwarzkopf.com

Praised by the New York Times as "excellent," YAHS alumni **Katherine Siochi** is an award-winning harp soloist and newly appointed principal harpist with the Sarasota Orchestra. Katherine is also the 2016 gold medalist of the 10th USA International Harp Competition, and was first prize winner of the American Harp Society's Young Professional division competition, earning her the title of AHS Concert Artist for 2015-2017. We are pleased to welcome her to the YAHS faculty for the first time in 2018.

Faculty

Preparatory Division Faculty — Duo Scorpio

Duo Scorpio, comprised of harpists Kathryn Andrews and Kristi Shade, is a New York City based harp duo on a mission to expand the duo harp repertoire by commissioning new works from innovative composers and discovering modern masterpieces already composed for this unique instrumentation. Duo Scorpio has been the recipient of a Classical Commissioning Grant, three grants from the American Harp Society, and an award from the Classical Recording Foundation. They have commissioned over ten works from composers such as Nico Muhly, Andy Akiho, and Paul Patterson. The duo has two albums on The American Modern Recordings Label: Scorpion Tales (2012) and Two Bridges (2017). Scorpion Tales was on the ballot nomination for the 2013 Grammy awards. Coincidentally, Katie and Kristi were both born on November 5, making them both Scorpios. They met in New York City while studying at the Manhattan School of Music, where they both received their Masters Degrees. Guest Artist Nancy Allen

We are thrilled to welcome Nancy Allen as our YAHS 2018 Guest Artist. Nancy holds prestigious positions as principal harpist with the New York Philharmonic and harp instructor at Juilliard and the Aspen Music Festival. She also appears regularly with The Chamber Music Society of Lincoln Center and the Orpheus Chamber Orchestra. Nancy Allen is a celebrated recording artist. Her recording of Ravel's Introduction & Allegro with the Tokyo String Quartet, flutist Ransom Wilson, and clarinetist David Shifrin was nominated for a Grammy award. Her other recordings can be found on labels such as Sony Classical, Deutsche Grammophon, and CRI, covering a variety of music from Bach to Ives to Takemitsu. In 1973, Nancy Allen won the Fifth International Harp Contest in Israel. She made her New York recital debut in 1975, and her early career included touring with flutist Ransom Wilson. She has also worked closely with Kathleen Battle, Richard Stoltzman, Manuel Barrueco, and Carol Wincenc on recital projects. As a teacher, Nancy Allen has coached some of the world's leading young talent, including YAHS alumni and USAIHC first prize winner Katherine Siochi, and YAHS faculty member Emily Levin. A teacher for over 20 years, her students hold positions in prominent orchestras around the world. Nancy's own teachers include the renowned Pearl Chertok, Lily Laskine, and Marcel Grandjany.





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
