Founded in 2002, the Young Artist's Harp Seminar (YAHS) is the preeminent summer training program for today's young harpists. Participants from around the US will once again travel to Kenyon College to take part in the two-week YAHS core program and the one-week YAHS Prep program. Concerts and masterclass events—which take place at Kenyon College—are open to the public.

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QUICK FACTS

- Program participants range in age from 8–26
- Admittance to YAHS is by audition; YAHS Prep requires no audition; the international competition final round is by invitation following a preliminary video entry round
- Daily activities include music theory, harp ensemble, private lessons, private practice, and classes on stage presence, performance anxiety, orchestra excerpts, and more
- YAHS alumni have gone on to attend conservatories such as Juilliard, the Cleveland Institute of Music, the Curtis Institute of Music, Indiana University, the Paris Conservatory, and many other top schools.
- Other alumni careers include music education, special education, physics, political science, nursing, aerial gymnastics, flight attendant, and more

HARP FAQ

- A concert grand harp has 47 strings, weighs approximately 80–90 lbs., and costs over \$10.000.
- Each of the harp's 47 strings must be tuned daily—that's nearly 3,000 strings per day at the Young Artist's Harp Seminar!
- A concert harp has 7 foot pedals that change the key. YAHS students are required to wear appropriate footwear (no flip flops or sandals!) to facilitate pedal movement.
- Harpists only use 8 out of 10 fingers: the pinky is too short to be efficient.
